

The Reader's Choice Book Club met over the summer and read *The Twilight Garden* by Sara Nisha Adams and *James* by Percival Everett. As part of the Founder's Day events, author Trish Lundy, who wrote *The One That Got Away with Murder*, did a talk and book signing about her book. During Founder's Day, the library had its big book sale. Over the course of three days the library raised approximately \$1,300 in donations for the books and items that were available. Other activities on that day were an all-day photo booth and a Makerspace activity. The mobile Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) unit will be at the library the first Wednesday of each month until October from 9 AM to 5 PM. Everyone is encouraged to stop by and see all that is available—they'll be parked out front of the library.

We hope your family was able to visit the well-received Story Walk installed at the Mokoma Conservancy. A series of succulent planting workshops were held at senior centers around the County in collaboration with the Master Gardeners of Bradford and Sullivan County, with an eye toward our strategic goal of programming for senior citizens.

As we move into fall, the library is preparing for regular children's story times every Wednesday. A back-to-schoolhomeschool kickoff pizza party will be held at the Mattern Building, and children's art classes by Dan Curry are being planned. An adult trip to Jim Thorpe, PA is in the works, as well as a career fair, and of course Halloween activities are lining up for a busy fall. We are considering Pokeman Club in October and need a volunteer to lead it. If interested contact Sarah Abernethy at the library. We are also looking for a volunteer to help coordinate adult programming at the library. Rebecca Aldinger did a great job helping with this, but is stepping down. This position is flexible and has only one year of service. You would be working with Melanie Lambert and myself, offering input into interesting programs, along with chaperoning and assisting with activities. Interested volunteers please contact me.


