

FROM THE LIBRARY

When I last wrote, we were just getting into the fall season and anticipating the arrival of the holidays and now we are looking forward to spring. Time flies!

In December, the Library participated in Christmas in Dushore, with a book sale at the library, craft activities, raffles, and food. Also during December, there was student art from Dan Curry's art classes displayed at the Library.

As we enter 2025, the Library continues keeping up an active calendar of activities for both adults and children. For adults, the **Readers' Choice Book Club** continues to select engaging titles and have great discussions. Recent choices have included *The Evolution of Annabel Craig* by Lisa Grunwald and *The Puzzle Box* by Danielle Trussoni. The **Midday Movie Matinee** continues to be popular with showings of *Harriet*, and *Meet me in St. Louis*. We watched *Cabrini*, with the IHM Altar and Rosary Society and *It Ends With Us* with Sullivan County Victims Services, who brought refreshments and led a discussion on the reality of difficult relationships.



Other adult programs have included holiday

Wreath Making with the Conservation District
staff, a Pressed Flower Valentine workshop with
Lori Beinlich (both held at the Ag Building in
Dushore), a Fly-Tying program at the Zion
Lutheran Church in Dushore with Rick Kintzer, and
an extremely popular program featuring Chef
John Moeller, former White House Chef. During
this program, held at the Mattern Building in
Mildred, Chef Moeller gave a cooking
demonstration, shared fascinating anecdotes
about his White House experiences, and signed his
book for those attending.



An intergenerational program which has attracted adults and young people has been the Wednesday **Mah Jongg** games. We also have a jigsaw puzzle at the library which we want to see completed so we can exhibit it. To help support the Library we have puzzles and games available to buy for any donation amount.

Children started the year with a "**Noon Year's Eve**" party at the Library. A large group of children and families participated with games and food. They counted down for "Noon" Year 2025 with toasts of sparkling cider and noise makers.

Children's programming in the new year has included **4H/Library Lego Club, Storytime**, and visits from the Bloomsburg Children's Museum bringing their **Mobile Maker Space.** This activity was a forensic science session—*Who Stole the Cookie?* The museum will be coming to the Library every other month through the end of the year. 


Thank you to the Lycoming County United Way serving Sullivan County Program Partner
