
Dinner and Drinks

The Sullivan Review was recognized for their support as a business, from providing printing and to helping advertise Friends' and Library events. Iain Campbell was recognized for an extraordinary contribution. The Best Friends in attendance were presented with small gifts. Further adding to the joy of the evening for those present was Sullivan County Commissioner Darlene Fenton's commendation of the Friends in their support of the Sullivan County Library saying, "The commissioners keep the lights on, but it's you guys who are the heart and soul of the library!"

The 2025 Duck Derby, hosted by the Friends of the Sullivan County Library, brought a lively crowd to downtown Dushore on Saturday, June 21. The annual event took place along Marsh Run, beginning at the bridge near Sullivan Terrace and ending at the bridge by Mary Beth's Westside Deli.

Organized by the Friends of the Sullivan County Library "Quack Pack," the race featured 500 rubber ducks sold in support of the library. The course, which stretches just under two-tenths of a mile, saw its fastest competitors cross the finish line in under 15 minutes. Ean Ammerman kept the crowd entertained with his colorful commentary throughout the race.

Well, it's been an amazing summer! Two of the library's biggest events were the Summer Reading Program and Founder's Day. Summer Reading's theme this year was "Color Our World." Children who participated got to work with the Eagles Mere Conservancy to make art with sun print paper, got to interact with the Sullivan County Conservation District on tree ring art, and went to World's End State Park to hone their skills at Japanese fish print art. At the end of the summer, 37 children were awarded prizes for their endeavors. The library also had a Summer Reading Challenge accepted by a good group of adult and teen patrons with a chances to win prizes in a drawing.

The second big event was Founder's Day. This year in addition to our big book sale, we had large oversize games for people to play. Games included chess, checkers, jenga, cornhole, and dominos. Look forward to seeing these games again at other community events.

The library continued its ever-popular Midday Movie Matinee, with the showing of *The Notebook, Mr. Smith Goes to Washington, The Big Year*, and a family matinee of *Harold and the Purple Crayon*. The Reader's Choice Book Club continues to meet and over the summer read the biography *The Paris Girl* by Francelle Bradford White and the enduring romance *Pride and Prejudice*, noting the 250th anniversary of Jane Austen's birth.



During July, the Library had a program about the Civilian Conservation Camps of Sullivan County, visiting Camp 96 in Hillsgrove, World's End State Park, and Camp 95 Forksville with speakers at each location. Sean Friedhoff (DCNR Service Forester), Jane Swift (World's End Environmental Educator), Gavin Seigfried (Sullivan County Historical Society), and Bill Williams (retired PA Game Commission educator) gave us a good understanding of the conservation efforts of the CCC and the impacts of the program on our county and on the whole country.

Also of mention, we enjoyed a free concert at Laporte Village Green with Eric Ian Farmer, co-sponsored by Eagles Mere Friends of the Arts, Sullivan County Council of the Arts, and the Lycoming United Way of North Central PA through the Friends of the Sullivan County Library.

Upcoming programs...

Watch for Tech Tuesday offerings at the Library. You may be able to learn about the all the digital offerings of the Library (like the Libby app for electronic books and ebooks), or get one-on-one instruction to help you understand and use your devices. We also offer Mah Jongg on Wednesdays and connection with Knit-n-Stitch ladies on Thursdays. We have a trip to Grey Towers and a fun instructional session on English Country Dancing planned. We will be back at Storytime for preschool children on September 10 and 4-H Lego club will soon start up. Again, you are urged to call or stop by the Library to find out more about children's programs.

As the country and the county prepares for American250, the Library has researched all the names of the Revolutionary War veterans who are interred within the county. 
